WHAT IS MAGGO?

Maggo is a product for treating flystrike, providing protection against restrike, and a docking medication.

Physical Description: Straw-coloured emulsion that may settle with time. After dilution with

water it is dense white and stable.

Prescription Animal Remedy Class: Unrestricted

Active Ingredients: 16 g/L PROPETAMPHOS, 400 g/L PARADICHLOROBENZENE.

Also contains 510 g/L HYDROCARBON LIQUIDS.

WHY CHOOSE MAGGO?

- For treatment of flystrike in sheep.
- Protection against restrike in sheep.
- As a docking medication.
- New Zealand made.

HOW TO USE MAGGO?

Directions:

READ ENTIRE LABEL BEFORE USE

- 1. Dilution rate is 1 part concentrate: 40 parts water.
- 2. Measure required amount of concentrate into suitable container and fill with water.
- 3. Shake to mix.
- 4. Apply diluted dressing to the struck area. Because maggots may move into clean wool it is important to apply mixture to wool surrounding the strike.
- 5. May also be used as a docking medication.

Warning: May be harmful if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. Causes skin irritation. May cause serious eye irritation. Suspected of causing cancer. Presumed to/may cause organ damage to the nervous system, blood or blood system from repeated exposure at high doses. Combustible liquid - Keep away from sources of ignition.

Handling Precautions:

Obtain special instructions before use. Do not handle until all safety precautions have been read and understood. Avoid skin and eye contact and inhalation of vapours. When handling wear waterproof gloves, protective clothing including eye protection. Wash hands and exposed skin before meals and after work. Do not eat, drink or smoke when using this product. Wash protective clothing before reuse.

Withholding Periods

- MEAT: 14 days.
- MILK: Milk intended for human consumption must be discarded for 35 days following the last treatment.
- WOOL RESIDUE: Ensure the time between dipping and subsequent shearing is at least two months, except in the case of spot treatment of flystrike.

Storage: Store securely below 25 °C (room temperature) in a well-ventilated place. Keep away from sources of ignition.
